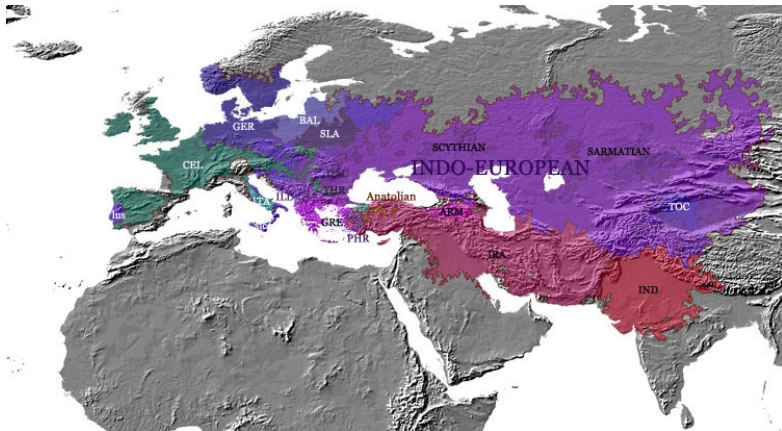

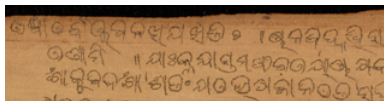

 'They don't give **them to him**'

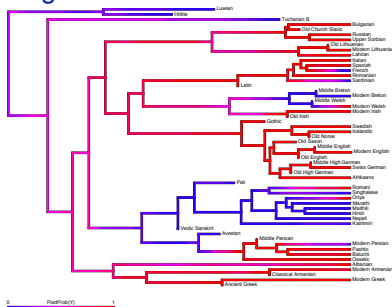

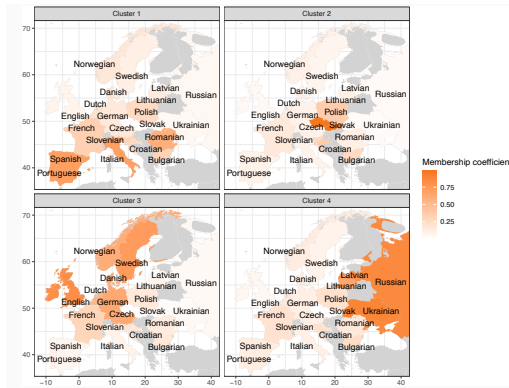
